## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Below are some frequently asked questions that have been presented in regards to the Alarm & Muster

### **What is the Alarm & Muster?**

The primary Mission of the Alarm & Muster (A&M hereafter) is to respond and alert its members of the limiting of personal freedom through political activity, primarily in the form of federal laws and programs of the current or any future administration, congress, and the judicial system. . These alerts are not only limited to federal activity but to any form of government activity that is contrary to this countries founding documents and the intent of the founding fathers. This call tree can also be activated in the case of local or regional disasters.

### **What do we believe?**

We believe that the Constitution of this country is the law of the land on which all other laws are or should be based. We believe in smaller government and less intrusion on the daily lives of the countries citizens.

### **Where is our focus?**

Our focus is to keep our members informed and to alert them of coming troubles that require their attention through use of the call tree via the A&M communications plan. We do not stipulate what the individual response to an alert is, other than to pass the word to the next person on the call tree. A&M does not restrict the activities of or membership in any other organization by its individual members. Participation in activities or membership in other organizations that do not embrace the limits A&M imposes upon itself; do not exclude the individuals from participation in the A&M call tree.

In short, our focus is getting vital information from the top levels to the lowest level of the call tree as rapidly as possible to give the local group time to respond with their already prepared plans of response for an alert. This also allows lowest levels to alert upper levels of the call tree for things heard or witnessed at the local level that would apply to primary mission.

This requires a local focus and planning on the part of local members as to what is an appropriate response and where to meet in the event of an actual emergency, etc. This also requires action on the part of local members to plan and communicate. The level of benefit from A&M to the individual member will be is directly related to the individual members level of commitment and involvement in A&M.

### **Bottom Line**

A&M will do all in its power to forewarn of events, help with training/education to meet those events, recruit new members to grow the local base of support, and lastly, send the Alert that an event is happening and that the individual/local group emergency plan should be activated and followed.

### **How is the A&M organized?**

Each of these levels has a point-of-contact (POC hereafter) responsible for disseminating, through the A&M communications plan, information both up and down the call tree to every member, these are the leaders of the group and the most vital are the state level and below POCs, they are the ones

that must guide and organize at the local level.

The levels are as follows:

National, Regional, State, District, Camp

- **National**  
Appoint and oversee Regional POC's, provide required support to members at a National level.
- **Regional POC**  
Oversee and administers multiple States and appoint State POC's
- **State POC**  
Appoints and oversees State Regional POC's - Can appoint as many State Regional POC's as required (i.e. In Georgia, the state is divided into 3 regions based on membership and population; North / Central / South. Central, because of population had a West and East Central. The Central District was split into two (2) State Regional Co-POC's: West Central, GA and East Central GA).
- **State Regional POC's**  
Oversee District POC's - Appoint as many District POC's as required
- **District POC**  
Oversees county / multiple counties or cities - appoint as many Camp POC's as required
- **Camp POC**  
Max 10 people per camp - as many camps as required to accommodate / support each District membership.

Each of these levels has a POC/s responsible for disseminating, through the A&M communications plan, information both up and down the call tree to every member, these are the leaders of the group and the most vital are the state level and below POCs, they are the ones that must guide and organize at the local level.

## What Happens to My Info When I Sign Up?

When you enter your information on the Join the Tree page (<http://alarmandmuster.com/Join.html>), the information is routed the point-of-contact (POC) over that region of the United States. That Regional POC will then sometimes contact the new member while also introducing them to the POC over the new member's state. The State POC *will* introduce him or herself and put you in touch w/ your Local POC (if there is one).

## Why a call-tree?

The call-tree is not a new concept in any fashion and is built in a hierarchal tree structure. The call-tree concept makes allows quick communication to multiple contacts in different physical locations. The call-tree structure of the old alarm and muster prior to the start of the American Revolution consisted of horse riders, lights, bells, and even musket and cannon shots. This rapid method of communication was responsible for towns as far as 25 miles to be alerted while British regulars were still be unloaded in Cambridge.

The call-tree structure also ensures that one person is not contacting more people than is necessary. If you're contacting more than 6 or 7 people, then your call-tree needs to branch!
